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### **Preface**

Within the boundaries of McDonough County, Illinois are more than a hundred cemeteries and gravesites ranging in size from a single burial site to the expansive Oakwood Cemetery at Macomb. Within these cemeteries are the remains of an estimated 40,000 individuals who have died since the first settler arrived here over 150 years ago. Graves of countless others are scattered over the countryside of McDonough County; but, exact sites of many of these resting places are no longer known for various reasons. During the early days of this county, there were obviously nocentral burial grounds; thus, a pioneer family having the misfortune of losing one of its members placed the ceased in a grave on a family homestead and erected a makeshift marker. Anumber of these family burial grounds later became public cemeteries, however, many of thegrave sites soon became "lost". Crude wooden markers or hand engraved stone soon succumbed to the elements and were never replaced; scores of families moved further west after staying in this area only a short time and the gravesites of their loved ones shortly became insignificant mounds of earth; a number of families passing through this vicinity suffered individual losses. A prime example of the latter is contained in a history of BethelTownship. In 1830, four children of an emigrantfamily died while enroute through McDonough County. They were buried near their places of death which occurred about two miles southwest of Fandon. All traces of those graves have long been gone. During the summer of 1834, a widow lady died ather home innorthernTennesseeTownship. Her coffin of dressed walnut lumber was built by a local cabinet maker and she was buried in the timber near her home. Within a few years, no evidence remained to indicate the presence of her final resting place. A family who created and excellent farm from the prairies a few miles north of Macomb, maintained a fenced family burial site for several years. This cemetery contained the graves of about 12 former family members. During the early 1900's, the farm changed ownership. Shortly thereafter, the new owner removed all the stones, took down the fence and this graveyard became part of a cornfield. These areonly three of the countless incidents involving the total disappearance of burial sites. At this time, it is impossible to determine the locations of hundreds of individual's graves in this county.

Vandalism is responsible forthedestruction of many grave stones. Countless markers have been partially ortotally destroyed. Inscriptions have been obliterated by gunshot blasts, stones have been broken into dozens of pieces, and some markers have been entirely removed from their original locations.

While weather-wear and vandalism accounts for most of the destruction of individual tombstones, neglect is directly responsible for the eventual deterioration of graveyards. Several local cemeteries have had no protective fencing for a number of years and the grounds have become grazing land for livestock. Groundhogs and other burrowing animals have undermined large portions of various cemeteries. Some areas are nearly invisible because of massive growth of weeds and brush. Stones have fallen, broken, and become completely covered with soil and debris.

The overall condition of our county cemeteries is a pathetic case. While some grounds are well maintained, or at least partially kept-up by various families, many have been totally forgotten. This situation is appalling and should never have come about. Apparently, lack of time, expense, and most of all regard has brought about the present-day poor conditions of many of our rural cemeteries.

Genealogical notes accompanying the various cemetery listings were prepared from a wide variety of sources including: Local area history books and atlases; newspaper files; county, state, and federal archives; family histories. These notes were collected at random from readily available sources and little, or no attempts were made to search for material for more complete genealogies. These notes are presented only for the purposes of identification and/or clarification.

Every attempt has been made to present complete and accurate information. Readers will find errors and omissions. Others will not agree with portions of my findings; however, no information contained herein is based solely on assumption or guesswork. It must be remembered that this information has been prepared for use only as a tool for further research and that nothing must be taken as final and absolute.

The larger cemeteries contained in these volumes are accompanied by grave location charts. These charts in no way are intended to represent any professionally prepared plat or survey that may exist. Their preparation and presentation are solely for general location purposes.

When copying inscriptions from grave markers, it is sometimes impossible to read some portions of the engraving. Names, dates, ages, etc. that were found to be unclear or totally missing are indicated by the use of question marks or dashes, i.e., SPICER, James T., infant son of ?J.B. & S.J.?; d. \_\_\_\_\_; age \_\_\_\_\_. The letters or numbers enclosed in parenthesis following the inscription, indicated general location as indicated on the accompanying chart.

### **ADDENDUM**

Mr. Lester's Magnum Opus is nothing short of monumental. It is not easy to gain access to many of these historic family burial sites. By the time of Mr. Lester's survey (1970's) numerous plots were long left abandoned, overgrown with trees and weeds and monuments under attack by weather, livestock, vandals, and property owners who did not care about the burial sites of McDonough County's brave pioneers. Thankfully, we now (2012) have laws to protect our county's historical legacy and these final resting gardens.


I am in awe of Mr. Lester for his transcriptions of hard-to-read tombstones and his laborious typing of his 18 Volumes of the Rural Cemeteries of McDonough County. He did not have access to a computer. In addition to transcribing information from tombstones, he had to painstakingly access county records (e.g. 1840 county tax list), federal census records, and local newspapers requiring a great deal of time and effort. As a genealogist in 2012, I have access to the internet with fast access to US Census records, Family Search (records kept by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints) and numerous other legal documents, books, and family journals. Mr. Lester used an old-fashioned key-strike, ribbon tape typewriter where mistakes were hard to correct and appear as overstrikes. There are very few attesting to his skill as a typist. What an US Census record will not contain are the names and dates of infants who died between census surveys. Mr. Lester's tombstone records give names and dates of children, whose lives were brief, but would otherwise be lost to history without his efforts. Frequently, he provides names of brothers and sisters, fathers and mothers that allows for completion of family group sheets.

Another work of love for those who dared to settle the prairie lands of western Illinois and raise their families is being performed by Dr. A. Gil Belles. He has been able to install signs for each of these rural cemeteries and provide GPS (Global Positioning System) information making it easier for anyone wishing to visit a rural cemetery to help them actually find it. Gil also works closely with Boy Scouts and other civic groups to help cleanup, clear brush and dead trees, locate buried tombstones, and restore stones. My revision of Mr. Lester's document will provide information on all cemetery restoration projects.

Any changes made to Mr. Lester's original work was done in blue color font. His maps were scanned and copied into the text and remain like his original work and are not subject to editing. His text was transcribed using MS Word, enabling me to control font size and color. Retyping text also leaves room for typo errors. Mr. Lester's rare typo errors are corrected but not displayed in blue. This MS Word document allows on-the-fly editing of any "Notes, Corrections, Additions, and Changes" found at the end of every cemetery. This was Mr. Lester's intent to produce a working document and improve accuracy about the information on those buried. I have retyped state abbreviations as they are now used (e.g. IL, instead of Ill.). On 1840 county tax lists I omitted cents (e.g. \$140, instead of \$140.00). The current MS Word font uses less space, thus, placing more text per line. This shrinks his documents and reduces pages. This, then, changes page numbering in each Table of Contents. 

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


Schayler

"Cemeteries of McDonough County, Illinois"




Section 14 Colchester Township, T5N R3&4W; 1913






Barber Cemetery not shown on plat book -- approximate location.

Stevens Cemetery not shown on plat book -- approximate location.



Location: Colchester Township, NE¼, section 14;  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile west of Colchester. This cemetery is accessed by angling of Hwy 136 on the west side of Colchester on county road 540E.  $\frac{1}{4}$ 0° 25′ 34.3″ N: 90° 48′ 37.9″W

Remarks: These grounds are fenced and maintained regularly, many of the older stones were badly weather-worn at the time of this study, made in mid-1973; the majority of the markers are standing upright.

## **Genealogical Notes – Widow Moore Cemetery**

**BETSON:** Infant female; d. Nov 30, 1881; age 1d; b. & d. Colchester.

**BOWMAN:** Daniel N.; native of TN, born in 1814; moved to this county in 1844 and lived in Tennessee Twp.; farmed here; a son, Thomas J., born here; later a furniture dealer in this area; Daniel farmed till 1856 and began mercantile business; he died in 1858 (date in error); Thomas married in Green Co. in 1842 to Margaret Parker, daughter of Thomas Parker; he a pioneer of this county. Thomas married Dec 13, 1883 to Bessie Brent, a native of England. Thomas in mining business from 1861 – 1870.

**BURTON:** Infant female; d. Jan 21, 1883; age 1m 1d; b. & d. Colchester.

**COWAN:** John & Jane (Mitchell) Cowan; both natives of Scotland; moved Scotland and lived 4-5; later returned to Nova Scotia; a son, Wm., born there on Feb 16, 1828; he married Mary Ann Bright, a native of England; she a daughter of Thomas and Mary Bright; elder Cowans moved to Clinton, Summet Co. OH about 1842; a few years later moved to Youngstown, OH then to Appanoose Co. IA; John died there in the fall of 1856; Jane then moved to Colchester. Wm. worked in coal mines and was supt. of Quinncy Coal Mine in Colchester; later ran dry goods store, farme and etc. Wm. and Mary Ann married in Lawrence Co. 

**BOYD:** Jane Ann; (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Mar 10, 1881): "Mrs. Boyd, daughter of Jos. Winship, died in Colchester township last Friday."

CLAYTON: Valentine B.; (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Mar 27, 1884): "Valentine B. Clayton was born Dec 18, 1818, in Washington Co. VA. His parents removed from VA to TN whe he was but a youth and from TN they came to McDonough county in 1835. They settled on Section 25 in Tennessee township and on this same piece of land, V.B. died yesterday of pneumonia. He married Mahala Doris Monk in July, 1847. They had 5 children – 2 daughters and 3 sons. Three survive him – a daughter and 2 sons, plus the widow. He was the only brother of W.W. Clayton of Colchester township....."

Valentine B. Clayton and Mahala Doris Monk were married in this county on Jul 21, 1847. They had 5 children: James F.; Susan E.; Charles W.; Wm. H.; and Mary E.; Mr. Clayton died Mar 26, 1884 and was buried at Bean Cemetery; his widow survived several years and was living in 1885 on the old homestead.

Henry F., from a family of 8; 6 living in 1907; bought farm on Section 33, Hire Twp.; married Oct 29, 1886 to Edie Young, native of this county; daughter of C.A. & Rebecca (Ireland) Young; they natives of OH; had 1 daughter, Bernice.

Joshua; moved to this county in 1831 or 1832 and settled a mile west of Colchester on the John Myers farm; there till 18?? and Hunt bought 370A in Hire Twp and built a house on Section 3 (this house later owned by his son, Simon W.). Joshua and his wife died at the old homestead on Section 3 and buried in Bean Cemetery a mile east of Colchester; Joshua was born in Washington Co. Lyons; Allen married Susan Lowderman and moved to Washington Terr; Alfred married Mary Wolley and also moved to Washington Terr.; Thomas lived in Hire Twp.; Marietta married Marion Bean and lived in Montana; Benton married George Williams and lived in Kansas; Simon W. Hunt had 8 children: Henry Franklin; Amanda Elsie who married Franklin Welsh and lived in Hire Twp.; Charles A.; Marshall Lee; Estella; Otto; and Kerua who died Dec 10, 1878; Reverdy. Simon owned about 600A. (See Moore Cemetery)

Maryette was a daughter of Samuel A. and Elizabeth (Heaton) Hunt; Mr. & Mrs. Hunt were married in Pike Co. IL in 1848; they lived in the Colchester area for a few years; then moved to Bushnell, where they stayed till about the mid-1870's; while living in Bushnell, two of their children, Cornelia and Samuel, died and were buried at Bushnell Cemtery; the Hunt family moved to Kingman Co. Remarks: This family graveyard is completely fenced and in relatively good condition. All stones were found to be standing upright. Reference the first and last burial dates noted above: The first known burial here was that of Mary D. Neece, first wife of Jesse Neece, in 1838. A large family stone contains information that would indicate an earlier burial; Elizabeth Neece died in 1826, just prior to her 5<sup>th</sup> birthday. She apparently died somewhere other than McDonough County as the Neece family did not arrive here until April, 1831. They had formerly lived in Sangamon County, Illinois.

KY; John later returned to NC and married Mary Davis, a daughter of John B. & Esther (Mattocks) Davis; she a native of NC; they were married in Dec 1818. John died Mar 16, 1874 and was buried in the Barber Cemetery; his wife died on Nov 26, 1861; they had 10 children; Esther M.; Robert; Edward D.; Priscilla Lee; Rachel Catharine; Mary Carr; Charles; Nancy Jane; Sarah Elizabeth; and John James. Esther lived in 1885 on the place where her parents settled in 1832 (section 19) and the old house was still standing then. Robert married Mary Stephens and lived in Lamoine Twp. Edward D. married Elizabeth Ripetow. Rache C. married James O. Taylor and lived in Kansas. Mary Carr married Caleb H. Rippetoe. Charles born & died in this county. Nancy Jane married E.H. Hamilton. John James married Elizabeth Barret. Mr. Barber helped build the first McDonough County Courthouse.

**STEVENS:** William D. Stevens was a son of Jacob Stevens, a native of VA. Jacob was a son of William D. Stevens, also born in VA; Jacob moved to E. TN; then to KY and there married Rhoda Doss, a daughter of John Doss of KY. William (d. 1885) married Mary Miler in IN in 1826. William, b. in KY Sep 5, 1806; the family moved to IN about 1811. William and Mary (Miler) Stephens lived in Harrison Co. IN till about 1839, when they moved to Schuyler Co. They lived there about a year, then moved to Chalmers Twp. in this county. They had the following children: Emily (Feb 1, 1827); Amanda (Oct 3, 1829); Lewain (Mar 6, 1831); Jasper Newton (May 20, 1833); Henry H. (Apr 1, 1836); Charles A. (Jan 12, 1840); Thomas (Dec 26, 1842); and Mary (Apr 15, 1850).

**STEVENS (Cont'd):** William D. (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Apr 23, 1885): "William D. Stevens died at his home in Chalmers township on Apr 19<sup>th</sup>, aged 78 years 7 months and 7 days. He was born in Shelby Co. KY in 1806. As a child, he came, with the family of his father, to Harrison Co. IN. He was married in 1829 to Miss Mary Mylor, who still survives. He was the father of 8 children, 6 of whom survive. The firm of Stevens Brothers in Colchester are his grandchildren. The funeral was Tuesday with burial on the farm near the house where he had died."

Charles A. Stevens, son of Wm. & Mary (Myler) Stevens; he ran a butcher shop in Colchester; married to Eliza E. Smith in 1860.

Jasper Newton Stevens, son of Wm. & Mary (Myler) Stevens; married in this county; Jasper went west in 1863 and was killed by Indians in Idaho Territory. A son, William O., was born in 1861; the son was raised by his grandfather, William D. W.O. later joined his Uncle Charles in the Stevens Bros. Meat Market.
