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### **Preface**

Within the boundaries of McDonough County, Illinois are more than a hundred cemeteries and gravesites ranging in size from a single burial site to the expansive Oakwood Cemetery at Macomb. Within these cemeteries are the remains of an estimated 40,000 individuals who have died since the first settler arrived here over 150 years ago. Graves of countless others are scattered over the countryside of McDonough County; but, exact sites of many of these resting places are no longer known for various reasons. During the early days of this county, there were obviously nocentral burial grounds; thus, a pioneer family having the misfortune of losing one of its members placed the ceased in a grave on a family homestead and erected a makeshift marker. Anumber of these family burial grounds later became public cemeteries, however, many of thegrave sites soon became "lost". Crude wooden markers or hand engraved stone soon succumbed to the elements and were never replaced; scores of families moved further west after staying in this area only a short time and the gravesites of their loved ones shortly became insignificant mounds of earth; a number of families passing through this vicinity suffered individual losses. A prime example of the latter is contained in a history of BethelTownship. In 1830, four children of an emigrantfamily died while enroute through McDonough County. They were buried near their places of death which occurred about two miles southwest of Fandon. All traces of those graves have long been gone. During the summer of 1834, a widow lady died ather home innorthernTennesseeTownship. Her coffin of dressed walnut lumber was built by a local cabinet maker and she was buried in the timber near her home. Within a few years, no evidence remained to indicate the presence of her final resting place. A family who created and excellent farm from the prairies a few miles north of Macomb, maintained a fenced family burial site for several years. This cemetery contained the graves of about 12 former family members. During the early 1900's, the farm changed ownership. Shortly thereafter, the new owner removed all the stones, took down the fence and this graveyard became part of a cornfield. These areonly three of the countless incidents involving the total disappearance of burial sites. At this time, it is impossible to determine the locations of hundreds of individual's graves in this county.

Vandalism is responsible forthedestruction of many grave stones. Countless markers have been partially ortotally destroyed. Inscriptions have been obliterated by gunshot blasts, stones have been broken into dozens of pieces, and some markers have been entirely removed from their original locations.

While weather-wear and vandalism accounts for most of the destruction of individual tombstones, neglect is directly responsible for the eventual deterioration of graveyards. Several local cemeteries have had no protective fencing for a number of years and the grounds have become grazing land for livestock. Groundhogs and other burrowing animals have undermined large portions of various cemeteries. Some areas are nearly invisible because of massive growth of weeds and brush. Stones have fallen, broken, and become completely covered with soil and debris.

The overall condition of our county cemeteries is a pathetic case. While some grounds are well maintained, or at least partially kept-up by various families, many have been totally forgotten. This situation is appalling and should never have come about. Apparently, lack of time, expense, and most of all regard has brought about the present-day poor conditions of many of our rural cemeteries.

Genealogical notes accompanying the various cemetery listings were prepared from a wide variety of sources including: Local area history books and atlases; newspaper files; county, state, and federal archives; family histories. These notes were collected at random from readily available sources and little, or no attempts were made to search for material for more complete genealogies. These notes are presented only for the purposes of identification and/or clarification.

Every attempt has been made to present complete and accurate information. Readers will find errors and omissions. Others will not agree with portions of my findings; however, no information contained herein is based solely on assumption or guesswork. It must be remembered that this information has been prepared for use only as a tool for further research and that nothing must be taken as final and absolute.

The larger cemeteries contained in these volumes are accompanied by grave location charts. These charts in no way are intended to represent any professionally prepared plat or survey that may exist. Their preparation and presentation are solely for general location purposes.

When copying inscriptions from grave markers, it is sometimes impossible to read some portions of the engraving. Names, dates, ages, etc. that were found to be unclear or totally missing are indicated by the use of question marks or dashes, i.e., SPICER, James T., infant son of ?J.B. & S.J.?; d. \_\_\_\_\_; age \_\_\_\_\_. The letters or numbers enclosed in parenthesis following the inscription, indicated general location as indicated on the accompanying chart.

#### **ADDENDUM**

Mr. Lester's Magnum Opus is nothing short of monumental. It is not easy to gain access to many of these historic family burial sites. By the time of Mr. Lester's survey (1970's) numerous plots were long left abandoned, overgrown with trees and weeds and monuments under attack by weather, livestock, vandals, and property owners who did not care about the burial sites of McDonough County's brave pioneers. Thankfully, we now (2012) have laws to protect our county's historical legacy and these final resting gardens.


I am in awe of Mr. Lester for his transcriptions of hard-to-read tombstones and his laborious typing of his 18 Volumes of the Rural Cemeteries of McDonough County. He did not have access to a computer. In addition to transcribing information from tombstones, he had to painstakingly access county records (e.g. 1840 county tax list), federal census records, and local newspapers requiring a great deal of time and effort. As a genealogist in 2012, I have access to the internet with fast access to US Census records, Family Search (records kept by the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints) and numerous other legal documents, books, and family journals. Mr. Lester used an old-fashioned key-strike, ribbon tape typewriter where mistakes were hard to correct and appear as overstrikes. There are very few attesting to his skill as a typist. What an US Census record will not contain are the names and dates of infants who died between census surveys. Mr. Lester's tombstone records give names and dates of children, whose lives were brief, but would otherwise be lost to history without his efforts. Frequently, he provides names of brothers and sisters, fathers and mothers that allows for completion of family group sheets.

Another work of love for those who dared to settle the prairie lands of western Illinois and raise their families is being performed by Dr. A. Gil Belles. He has been able to install signs for each of these rural cemeteries and provide GPS (Global Positioning System) information making it easier for anyone wishing to visit a rural cemetery to help them actually find it. Gil also works closely with Boy Scouts and other civic groups to help cleanup, clear brush and dead trees, locate buried tombstones, and restore stones. My revision of Mr. Lester's document will provide information on all cemetery restoration projects.

Any changes made to Mr. Lester's original work was done in blue color font. His maps were scanned and copied into the text and remain like his original work and are not subject to editing. His text was transcribed using MS Word, enabling me to control font size and color. Retyping text also leaves room for typo errors. Mr. Lester's rare typo errors are corrected but not displayed in blue. This MS Word document allows on-the-fly editing of any "Notes, Corrections, Additions, and Changes" found at the end of every cemetery. This was Mr. Lester's intent to produce a working document and improve accuracy about the information on those buried. I have retyped state abbreviations as they are now used (e.g. IL, instead of Ill.). On 1840 county tax lists I omitted cents (e.g. \$140, instead of \$140.00). The current MS Word font uses less space, thus, placing more text per line. This shrinks his documents and reduces pages. This, then, changes page numbering in each Table of Contents. 
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Areas covered by volumes I - XVII
"Cemeteries of McDonough County, Illinois"




Section 2

Remarks: This cemetery is completely fenced and is regularly maintained. It was named in honor of the Harris family who moved to this neighborhood in the early 1830's from the State of New York.

**ASHLY:** Infant dau of John & Pauline (Fordyce) Ashley; d. Sep 6, 1921.

**BAILY:** Jacob L. (1851-1921), son of Thos. and Nancy (Bottenburg) Baily; born in Vermont Twp. Fulton Co. IL, Aug 29, 1851; moved to this county with parents in 1855; lived in Eldorado Twp.; Jacob attended school at Oberlin (OH) College and at Northwestern Univ.; taught school for a few years; admitted to bar in 1878; later became a partner with a Macomb lawyer, William Prentiss; married in Aug 1876 to Lois C. Foster; had a daughter, Jessie P.

Lois C. (1858-1945), wife of Jacob; daughter of John N. and Frances Jane Foster of Eldorado Twp.; other members of the Foster family included Lois' parents, are buried in the Foster Point Cemetery. Frances Jane Foster maiden name was McClintock.

**BERRY:** Archie J. (1880-1951), born in Eldorado Twp. Dec 12, 1880; son of James J. and Mary (Campbell) Berry; James attended local schools and the Metropolitan Business College at Chicago; he then returned to this township and farmed his parents place; he was married on Jan 12, 1905 to Blanch Johns.

James J. (1856-1933), born in Eldorado Twp.; son of Thomas and Nellora (Harris) Berry; married to Mary Campbell; they had four children.

Mary A. (1855-1919), wife of James J.; born in Oquawka, IL

Henry (1859-1881) (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Oct 22, 1881): "Henry Berry of Eldorado Twp. died Saturday, aged 22 years; son of Thomas Berry; survived by his parents and an older brother...."

**BREED:** Ella, Kate & Edoline were daughters of Dr. Simon & Alzine S. (Powers) Breed who were married in this county on Dec 25, 1848.

Simon P., father of Ella, Kate & Edoline, were living in Schuyler Co. IL in 1850; he appears on the 1840 federal census for that county, residing in Frederick Twp.; Simon was born in the State of Vermont about 1828. Simon was a physician. There were no children listed in the Breed family in 1850.

**BUTLER:** Cyrus F. (d. 1861); enlisted in New Salem Twp.; served with Co C Engr Reg of MO; died on Oct 18, 1861, at Ft. Laramie, Wyo.

**COX:** Thomas (1801-1892); born in Chester Co. PA; moved to IL in 1853; moved to this county in 1856; lived in Eldorado Twp.; married Emma Johnson in PA and they had 10 children. Emma (Johnson) Cox died about 1850. Thomas was a candidate for county coroner on the Dem. Ticket in 1874 and again in 1876; he was defeated on both occasions.

**COX (Cont'd):** William (1848-1926), youngest child of Thomas and Emma (Johnson) Cox; born in Guernsey Co. OH on Oct 8, 1848; moved to this county with his father and brothers and sisters about 1856 and lived on section 11, Eldorado Twp.; William's mother died when he was 2 years old; William lived on the family farm till about 1903, when he moved to Macomb and became an insurance agent. Married on Sep 30, 1874, to Alveretta Beal; they had the following children: Bertha (1875); Mabel (1877), (Mrs. Dilworth); Clifford (1879); Gaylord and Mildred.

Alveretta (1853-1937), also called Ritta, wife of William; daughter of David Beal of Vermont, IL, was born in Beaver Co. PA.

**DOUGLAS:** John (1783-1862); born in Scotland; son of George Douglas; married Janet Maine; had 11 children; moved to America in 1852; settled in Eldorado Twp.; after the death of his first wife in 1859, Mr. Douglas married Jane Wiley, also of Scottish descent. The youngest child of John and Jennet Douglas, Adam, was born in Scotland on Dec 31, 1833; he later moved to Macomb Twp. and married Catherine Kelly.

**FOSTER:** Sanford Karr (1854-1918), son of John N. and Frances J. (McClintock) Foster; they, and other members of the Foster family are buried at Foster Point Cemetery; S.K. was a brother of Lois (Mrs. Jacob Baily), Willie M., and Josephine.

Henry L. (1865-1937), born in Eldorado Twp.; son of Samuel J. and Mary (McMahon) Foster; brother to Sarah V. (Mrs. William Vail); A.D.; James L.; Eva; ZNellie C. (Mrs. William Barkley); Luella (Mrs. Edward Ausbury); and Samuel R.

**GRAVES:** Allen (d. 1863); enlisted in the army in New Salem Twp. on Aug 7, 1862; died in TN at age 24y.

Bell; d. Nov 24, 1923; age 59y 11m 1d; b. Dec 30, 1863, in this county; daughter of John & Mary (Pittinger) Graves; John, a native of VA; Mary b. in IL; Bell never married; died in Mound Twp.

**GRIFFIN:** William A., father of the 2 children buried at Harris Cemetery, came to this county in 1850, from Ashland Co. OH; he farmed on section 33, Eldorado Twp.

**HARRIS:** James (1782-1850), born in Plainfield, MA; son of Daniel and Lucy (Fox) Harris; Daniel Harris and his brother, Nathan, were sons of Isaac Harris, who came to this country from England during the late 1600's; both Daniel and Nathan were veterans of the Revolutionary War. James' mother died when young and he lived with his grandfather in CT for several years; he later lived in Niagara Falls and Syracuse, NY; moved to this county in 1834 and settled in Eldorado Twp.; married in NY on Dec 15, 1802, to his first cousin, Prudence Harris.

Prudence (1785-1853), wife of James Harris; daughter of Nathan and Prudence (ParK) Harris, all natives of Plainfield, Ct

Nathan (1787-1856), son of Nathan and Prudence (Park) Harris and brother to Prudence Harris, wife of James.

James (1808-1876), born in NY; moved with parents to Berkshire Co, MA at age 9 years; at age 17 years he left home and first went to Canada; then, after 3 years, returned to MA; married there; moved to Cayuga Co. NY; then to Onondaga Co. NY; lived there till moved to this county in about 1832; lived on section 1, Eldorado Twp.

James appears on the 1840 county tax list as #551 (NOTE: Nothing to indicated if this is James Jr. or Sr.): He owned 160 acres in section 1, Eldorado Twp. and 160 acres in section 24, New Salem Twp.; residence on the NE¼ of section 1 Eldorado Twp.; he also owned \$160 worth of horses, \$247 cattle, \$2 in clocks and watches, \$25 wagons, and \$236 in other property; total taxes were \$9.75.

**HARRIS (Cont'd):** Hiram (1839-1878) and Daniel W. (18?6?8-1879); sons of Daniel and Laura (Mayo) Harris; Daniel was a son of James and Prudence Harris and was born in Chenango Co. NY in 1806.

Hiram H., husband of Lydia (Rutledge) Harris, appears on the 1840 tax list #553; he owned 80 acres in the NW¼ of section 1, Eldorado Twp.; no personal property listed; taxes were \$1.60

Daniel, father of Hiram (d. 1878) and Dan'l (d. 1879) appears on the 1840 county tax list as #554; he owned no real estate; had \$140 worth of horses, \$180 cattle, \$65 wagons, and \$95 in other property; taxes were \$2.40.

Alice (1878-1950), wife of Horace; daughter of Alfred and Priscilla (Cox) Warner.

**HOBERT:** Luther H., husband of Harriet J. (d. 1848) appears on the 1840 county tax list as "Luther H. Hobard" on line #560; he owned 80 acres in the NE¼ of section 12, Eldorado Twp.; also had \$135 worth of horses, \$80 cattle, \$30 carriages; and \$120 in other property; taxes were \$3.87.

**HUGHES:** George (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Aug 4, 1881): "George Hughs, father of the Rev. John Hughs, died near Table Grove, Fulton Co. last Saturday, July 30<sup>th</sup>."

**KEACH:** James (1824-1901) was born in OH and moved to this county in 1853, from Fulto Co. IL; he farmed on section 33, Eldorado Twp.

KERR: Wyllie M. (1869-1950), wife of William S.; daughter of John N. and Frances J. (McClintock) Foster.

**KIMBLE:** Anna, born Nov 20, 1881 in IL; d. Sep 12, 1921; age 39y 9m 22d; daughter of John & Cyrene (Fowler) Nelson, both natives of IL. Mrs. Kimble died at Holmes Hospital in Macomb.

**KINNE:** Justus H. (1806-1868) appears on the 1840 county tax list as #552 (between James and Hiram H. Harris): he owned 80 acres adjoining the farm of Hiram H. Harris in the NW¼ of section 1, Eldorado Twp.; no personal property is listed, as was the case with Mr. Harris, indicating that both owned real estate in this county, but lived or resided outside the county.

James H. (d. 1863) (NOTE: Name spelled as "Kennie" in some sources). Enlisted in the army at New Salem Twp. on Aug 7, 1862; promoted to Sergeant; died of wounds at Chattanogga, TN on Oct 20, 1863.

Mary F.; b. TN; d. Feb 22, 1881 in Farmers Twp., Fulton Co. of pneumonia.

**LAWYER:** J. Newton (1856-1937), son of Thomas and Catherine (Comer) Lawyer; born in Eldorado Twp., Jan 22, 1856; J.N. was third in a family of 8 children; married in January, 1880, to Jennie McFadden; they had two children: R. Leah and Etha.

MC GREW: Karl I. (1882-1954), son of Franklin P. and Orinda (Babcock) McGrew; brother to Lawrence A.; Cora A.; (Mrs. G.R. Adams); and Verna.

**MORAN:** William B. (1826-1897), son of Thomas and Sarah J. Moran; born near Baltimore, MD; married on Jan 1852 to Sarah Jane Turner; she died and left a daughter, Sarah J. (later Mrs. James M. Arnold); William then married on Nov 6, 1856 to Mary J. Turner; had 5 children; Sarah Julia (Mrs. Wm. Leighty); Mary E. (Mrs. Thos. Moran); Susie; Elizabeth (Mrs. Bugg); and Samuel T.

**MORAN (Cont'd):** William B. (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Eagle, Jan 21, 1897): "William Moran died at the home of his son Sam, in Sciota township, Thursday. He left his home Wednesday morning of last week seemingly in his usual health, and that night was taken sick at eight o'clock. He died Thursday morning at half past four....."

Mary J. (1826-1890), wife of William; daughter of Sam'l and Sallie Turner of Fulton Co. IL

**MULLEN:** Edward; d. Feb 27, 1922; aged 54y 3m 26d; b. Oct 31, 1867 in IL; son of Wm. & Lydia (Hummel) Mullen; farmed in New Salem township.

**POWERS:** Abraham (1825-1909), born in Hardwick, Vermont; son of Isaac and Rachel (Marshall) Powers; the family moved to this county in 1833; lived on section 1, Eldorado Twp.; Abraham married on Dec 25, 1848 in this county to Frances M. Reesor; continued living on Eldorado Twp. till 1867, when they moved to New Salem Twp.; later moved to the town of Bardolph; had 4 children: -- Rachel M.; Lucy E.; Willard R.; and Orville M. The two sons, later organized the Metropolitan Business College at Chicago. [See Notes, Corrections, Additions & Changes]

Frances M. (1828-1906), wife of Abraham; born in Montgomery Co. OH; the family moved to this State in 1834; her maiden name was Reesor; they lived in Tazwell Co. before moving to this county and to Eldorado Twp.

Isaac (1793-1836); born in the State of Vermont; a cousin of sculptor, Hiram Powers; Isaac and family moved to this county in 1833 and lived in Eldorado Twp.; Mr. Powers was killed when a team of horses which he was driving ran away.

**RABY:** Guy M. (1888-1966), son of Jacob and Julia (Harlan) Raby; brother of George, Earl, Mary, Emma, Nellie, and Ivan. Jacob was a native of Ashland Co. OH; Julia was born in this county.

**WARNER:** Alfred (1842-1909), born in Onondaga Co. NY Jul 7, 1842; son of James and Denise (Rust) Warner; moved to this county in 1855 and first lived in Blandinsville Twp.; later moved to Eldorado Twp.; Alfred lived in the J.E. Harris home till 1861; then enlisted in the army and served throughout the Civil War; discharged on Sep 10, 1864; returned to this county and bought a New Salem Twp. farm; married on Oct 28, 1875 to Priscilla Cox; they had 5 children; Mary; Alice (Mrs. Horace Harris); Delphine; Harold; and Carl.

**WATERS:** Edward (1843-1919), born in New Orleans, LA Jun 11, 1843; son of James and Ella (Keys) Waters; James was born in Ireland; Ella, born in New Orleans; both parents of Edward died in New Orleans; Edward moved to Morgan Co. IL at age 2 years, with a brother; lived there 10 years; then moved to this county and worked several years for Clayburn Kerr; enlisted in the army on Sep 3, 1861 and was mustered out in 1864; returned to this county and bought a farm in New Salem Twp.; married on Dec 7, 1865, to Lydia Lois Kerr; they had 10 children: Ella J.; George; M. Hettie; Gertrude; Frank; Edward; Dora; Grace; Ralph; and Vera.

**WETZEL:** Allen Charles; d. May 11, 1921; age 57y 4m 5d; b. Jan 6, 1864; b. near Table Grove; son of John M. & Margaret (Graves) Wetzel; John born in VA; Margaret in OH; Allen was a farmer and was married; he died in TN Twp.

Melissa G. (1861-1929), wife of Willis G.; daughter of Eli and Mary A. (McKee) Elwell.

### **FOSTER POINT CEMETERY**

Location: Eldorado Township, NE¼, section 2; four miles southeast of Adair. . It is located about two miles west southwest of Table Grove at the junction of N550 Rd and E2300 St.  $40^{\circ}$  21' 29.2" N:  $90^{\circ}$  28' 7.5"W

Remarks: Foster Point Cemetery, named for the pioneer family of Arthur J. Foster, was established in the 1830's. Currently, it is periodically maintained and it is in fair condition. A number of the stones are broken; may are badly weather-worn. The grounds are fairly well fenced. Jonas Hobart, one of the very few veterans of the Revolutionary War buried in this county, was interred here about 1833.

**ELWELL:** Eli (1827-1862), born in Ohio; moved to this county in 1845; married here on Mar 1, 1849, to Mary A. McKee; had 7 children: Jonathan D.; James M.; Julia E. (Mrs. John Dickey); Malissa G. (Mrs. Willis Wetsel); Mary E.; Frances E.; and Thomas.

Mary A. (1827-1921), wife of Eli; daughter of James and Elizabeth (Plastens) McKee; born in Sangamon Co. IL; her father, James, was born in Hardin Co. KY in 1803; her mother was born in 1805 in OH.

Delia Emily (1853-1915), wife of Jonathan D.; maiden name was Silvernail; she and her husband, J.D., lived on the Elwell farm with Mrs. Elwell

James M. (1852-1887), son of Eli and Mary (McKee) Elwell; born in this county on Feb 1, 1852; married to Virgie Williams and lived in Eldorado Twp. (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Mar 24, 1887): "James Elwell died in New Salem Twp. on March 16<sup>th</sup>, aged 35 years, 1 month and 15 days. He was born Feb 1, 1852 in this county; his father, Eli Elwell, was killed in the Civil War. James married 8 years ago to Virginia Williams, a daughter of Lafayette Williams. Mr. and Mrs. Elwell have been living on Mr. Williams' farm near Adair ....."

Julia; d. Nov 31, 1879; age 4y 4d; b. & d. New Salem Twp.

Lois; d. Nov 31, 1879; age 2y 11m 4d.; b. & d. New Salem Twp.

**FOSTER:** Arthur J. (1800-1843) born in S.C.; married Sarah Kelso; lived in Dubois Co. IN before moving to Logan Co. IL in 1831; later that year the family moved to this county and established a farm home in Eldorado Twp.; the area later became known as Foster's Point. The 7 children of A.J. and Sarah Foster were: Henry W.; William D.; John M.; Samuel J.; Sarah (Mrs. James H. Lowe); Abner D.; and Johanna C. (Mrs. J.S. Gettis).

A.J. appears on the 1840 county tax list as #547; he owned 110 acres in the SW¼ of section 1, Eldorado Twp.; he also owned \$250 worth of horses, \$100 cattle, \$50 wagons, and \$440 in other property; taxes were \$6.95

Sarah (1803-1895), wife of A.J.; maiden name was Kelso; born in SC; moved to IN during the 1820's; married there to Mr. Foster in early 1820's.

**FOSTER (Cont'd):** Moses (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Feb 10, 1887): "Moses Foster of Mound Twp. died February 7<sup>th</sup>. He was born near Venice, Indiana on Apr 21, 1811, but moved to Illinois and settled near Foster's Point in this county. He followed Capt. A. Lincoln in driving the Indians out of the southern part of this state. He was married 3 times, 2 of his wives are buried at the Foster Point graveyard, and one survives him, as do 4 children ......" Moses and Mary H. McCord were married in this county Mar 13, 1849. Moses appears on the 1840 county tax list as #546, he owned 50 acres in the SW¼ of section 1, Eldorado Twp.; also had \$105 worth of horses; \$32 cattle; \$40 wagons; and \$25 in other property; taxes were \$2.76.

John N. (1829-1916), son of Arthur J. and Sarah Foster; born in IN; moved with parents to this county in 1831; lived on section 2, Eldorado Twp.; John married in 1852, to Frances J. McClintock; had 4 children: Sanford Karr; Lois (Mrs. Jacob Baily); Wyllie M.; and Josephine.

Bessie Grand (1877-1879) daughter of Sanford Karr and Sarah M. Foster; Mr. & Mrs. Foster are buried in the Harris Cemetery.

Elizabeth A. (1830-1917), wife of William D.; daughter of William and Nancy (Decker) McClintock.

**FROST:** James Arthur (d. 1866) was a son of Samuel and Frances (Murphy) Frost; Mr. Frost was born in OH in 1832; later moved to Fulton Co. IL and to this county in 1858; he and Miss Murphy were married in 1850; the Frost family later moved to Macomb where Mr. Frost became connected with the Macomb Tile Company. Sam'l and Frances had 9 children: Celia (Mrs. Ezra Rinehart); George; Charlie; Albert; John; Hattie (Mrs. Samuel Dawson); Mary (Mrs. Joseph Kline); William; and James A. Mr. Frost served as sheriff on McDonough County from 1872- 74; he was a veteran of the Civil War.

**HOBART:** Jonas (no dates), is one of the three known veterans of the Revolutionary War buried in this county. According to VA records, Mr. Hobart was born in New Hampshire on Nov 15, 1744; a brother Isaac, was killed at the Battle of Bunker Hill; Jonas enlisted on Mar 17, 1777 and served as a corporal in the 4<sup>th</sup> Company, 1<sup>st</sup> Regiment, NH troops. He was wounded at the Battle of Ticonderoga; he was discharged on Jan 1, 1781; he later moved to Schuyler Co., and lived there a number of years. He died in Nov 1833.

Jonas and his wife arrived in Schuyler Co. IL in early 1823; their son, Calvin and his family, had settled in Rushville Twp. a few weeks earlier; accompanying Mr. & Mrs. Hobart in their moving to Schuyler Co. was their granddaughter, Miss Ruth Powers.

The 1830 Federal Census for Schuyler-McDonough Counties indicates Mr. and Mrs. Jonas Hobart were living in the household of their son, Calvin. Among those persons enumerated in that census in the Hobart household were: 3 males between 15 and 20; 1 male between 40 and 50 (Calvin); a male between 80 and 90 (Jonas); a female, 5-10; a female 10-15; a female 40-50 (Calvin's wife); and a female between 80 and 90 (Jonas' wife).

H.F. Kelso, b. IN; came here in 1865 from Howard Co. IN; in 1871 was a resident of section 18, Mound Twp.

Sam'l G. Kelso; came here in 1861 from Dubois Co. IN; b. in SC; in 1871 was a resident of section 35, Macomb Twp.

**MC CLINTOCK:** William (1803-1869) born in Washington Co. PA; son of Robert and Rebecca (Karr) McClintock; Robert was born in Scotland and was a weaver by trade; Rebecca was born in County Tyrone, Ireland; the family moved to Muskingum Co. OH; William married there to Nancy Decker; they moved to Fulton Co., IL in 1839; then in 1843 they came to this county and began farming on section 14, Eldorado Twp.; he moved to Macomb in 1855 and owned a stone quarry for several years; he died in 1869 of "stone-cutter's consumption". William and Nancy had 9 children: Elizabeth Ann (Mrs. William D. Foster); Karr; Frances Jane (Mrs. John N. Foster); James S.; Catherine M. (Mrs. H.H. Smith); Richard H.; Margaret (Mrs. Mark Ullery); Rebecca L. (Mrs. E. Hill; and William W.

Nancy (1806-1899), wife of William; born in Jersey Co. OH; maiden name was Decker; after the death of her husband in 1869, Mrs. McClintock lived for several years with her oldest daughter, Rebecca.

Richard H. (1841-1863), son of Wm. and Nancy; enlisted in the army on Jul 31, 1862.

**SMITH:** Tella M. (1862-1864), daughter of H. H. and Catherine M. (McClintock) Smith; Catherine was a daughter of Wm. and Nancy McClintock; Mr. and Mrs. Smith later moved to Nebraska.

**WILKINS:** Benjamin (1794-1843) appears on the 1840 county tax lists as #557; he owned 30 acres in the SE of section 26, New Salem Twp.; also owned \$75 worth of horses, \$20 cattle; and \$50 in other property; taxes were \$1.48.

Martha (Gay) Wilkins married Eli Branson in this county on Jan 13, 1847.
